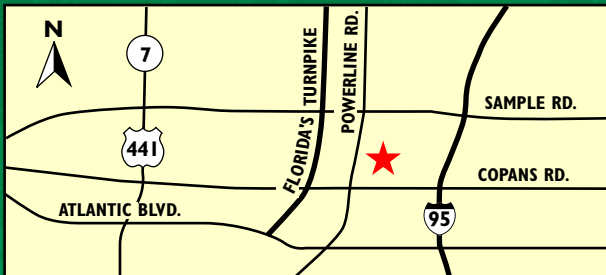


Drop-Off Locations

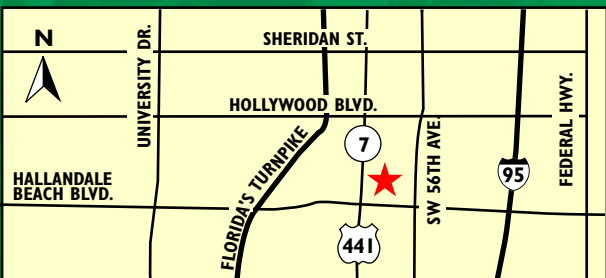
Broward County Waste and Recycling Services offers a free and convenient program to dispose of used electronics in an eco-friendly way at the following collection centers:

North Residential Collection Center



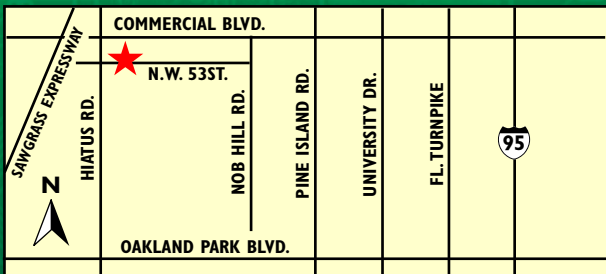

Why Recycle Electronics?

- It's a free program for Broward County residents—just bring proof of residency such as a driver's license or tax bill.
- By using our program, you decrease the amount of trash and toxins such as lead, mercury and chromium, that go to a landfill or waste-to-energy plant.
- E-cycling saves and recovers many natural resources such as gold, copper and aluminum, which can then be used in new products.
- Recovering valuable minerals from old electronics saves electricity because it takes less energy to recover and recycle natural resources than to mine raw materials from the earth.



What Happens To Your Used Electronics?

Broward County has partnered with ARC Broward (Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc.) to divert end-of-life electronics out of landfills and waste-to-energy plants, and into an eco-friendly recycling system. All materials collected are recycled, refurbished or disposed of in an environmentally safe manner.

ARC Broward is a private, non-profit organization serving people with disabilities. The program provides an excellent opportunity for vocational training, and promotes self-sufficiency among the people served by ARC Broward.

Because ARC Broward is a 501 (c)(3) charitable organization, you can receive a tax deduction for donated electronics.

Small Business E-Cycling

As Broward County's Electronics Recycling Contractor, ARC Broward will also accept end-of-life (EOL) electronics at no charge from most small businesses within partner cities (see list on back).

Eligible small businesses generally include those with 25 or fewer employees. Businesses such as TV or computer repair shops, installation services or electronics retailers are not eligible for the free service and may contact ARC Broward or other EOL vendors (go to our website for a link to a list) to make disposal arrangements, which may involve a fee.

Please call ARC Broward at 954-577-4160 and ask for the electronics recycling manager for details and hours of operation.

Rechargeable Batteries

Cell phones, remote control toys, laptops and power tools are just a few household items that use rechargeable batteries containing cadmium or lithium, both of which are considered toxic heavy metals.

Due to a growing concern over toxins in the environment, Florida passed a law prohibiting the disposal of rechargeable batteries in regular trash.

Regular Household Batteries

Common household alkaline batteries, such as AA and D, no longer contain mercury and are safe to dispose of in your regular garbage.

In 1996, the Federal Battery Act mandated that the use of mercury in household batteries be phased out. The newly designed alkaline battery is not considered toxic according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.



Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFLs) and Tubes

Compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) and fluorescent tubes contain small amounts of mercury and should be disposed of using Broward County's free Household Hazardous Waste program. Drop-off locations and hours of operation are located on the map panel of this brochure.
